What is a Tabletop Exercise?

A Tabletop Exercise (TTX) is a collaborative workshop that uses real-world scenarios to practice your Incident Response Plan. A cybersecurity expert facilitates the session to provide your team with a safe environment to walk through, understand, and improve your documented plan. Participants should include technical and executive team members to ensure coordination, communication, and escalation procedures are tested.

How often?

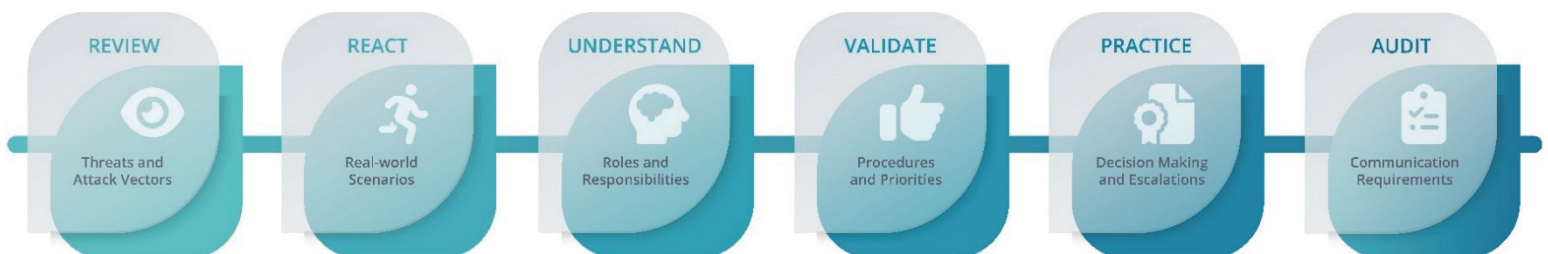
NIST SP 800-84¹ recommends companies conduct tabletop exercises at least once per year. NIST also recommends repeating the process following organizational changes and updates to any IT plan. Gartner urges organizations to increase the frequency of tabletop exercises during times of global unrest² ensuring “triage and decision-making are not made on the fly.”

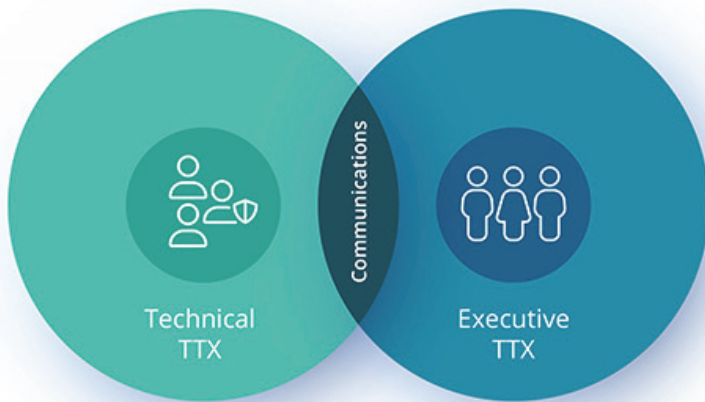
